## What kind of scholarships and grants are available?

**Need-based scholarships** help Washington State families finance the cost of Jewish overnight camp tuition. We ensure that you receive the assistance you need.

For **first-time campers**, a One Happy Camper grant can provide up to \$1,000 off the cost of a Jewish overnight camp experience.



First-time camper incentive grants are offered in partnership with the Foundation for Jewish Camp's One Happy Camper program.

## Scholarship or Grant Eligibility

- \* **Need-Based Camp Scholarship Requirements**
  - Camper must be a Washington State resident and be signed up with a traditional Jewish camp in the U.S. or Canada
- \* **First-Time Camper, One Happy Camper Grant Requirements**
  - Camper cannot attend a Jewish day school; the grant is for first-time immersive Jewish experiences
  - Camper must be entering grades 2-10 in the fall
  - Camper needs to be registered for camp before applying for the grant
  - Camper must be attending a non-profit Jewish overnight camp for at least 12 days for the first time. Campers who have only attended for less than 12 days before are still eligible
